GOALS

HEALTH

Support the mental and physical health needs of ALICE households in the SAW Community.

EDUCATION

Enhance education in the SAW area by focusing on literacy, early childhood education, and school readiness.

FINANCIAL STABILITY

Assist with the immediate and long-term financial needs of ALICE households.

CONNECTOR

Serve as a connector and convener for people and resources.

HEALTH

Support the mental and physical health needs of ALICE households in the SAW Community.



- Identify service, navigational, and informational gaps related to health.
- Determine appropriate resources and stakeholders to bridge health gaps.
- Secure funding to employ appropriate resources and stakeholders to meet the health needs of the community.



EDUCATION

Enhance education in the SAW area by focusing on literacy, early childhood education, and school readiness.



- Implement the strategies of Virginia Early Childhood Foundation's Ready Regions Blue Ridge.
- Support Preschool Coordinated Enrollment through Go2Grow SAW.
- Provide every three-and four-year-old child in SAW the opportunity to participate in the Dolly Parton Imagination Library program.
- Organize an annual school supply drive (Stuff the Bus) to help ALICE families prepare for the start of school.
- Advocate to stakeholders and local businesses for increased affordable childcare options.



FINANCIAL STABILITY

Assist with the immediate and longterm financial needs of ALICE households.



- Remove transportation as a barrier for employment for ALICE families.
- Support organizations and programs that address housing needs in the community.
- Facilitate an income tax assistance program (Valley VITA) to provide no-cost tax preparation for households with an income of \$57k or less.
- Provide direct resources to community members with an immediate need.



CONNECTOR

Serve as a connector and convener for people and resources.



- Create and expand awareness of available community resources.
- Foster a positive experience for donors, volunteers, community members, and community organizations.
- Create an intentional space to connect community members from different backgrounds, to build trust and understanding of diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- Host a Community Investment Grant Program.
- Bring awareness to the community regarding the ALICE Population.



ALICE



ALICE, an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed, is a way of defining and understanding the struggles of households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level, but not enough to maintain a bare-bones household budget.

For far too many families, the cost of living outpaces what they earn. These households struggle to manage even their most basic needs—housing, food, transportation, child care, health care, and necessary technology.

When funds run short, cash-strapped households are forced to make impossible choices, such as deciding between quality child care or paying the rent; filling a prescription or fixing the car. These short-term decisions have long-term consequences not only for ALICE families, but for all of us.

We see ALICE every day in the SAW Region. On average 41% of our neighbors live below the ALICE threshold. That equates to 19,910 households who are below the ALICE threshold in Staunton, Waynesboro, and Augusta County combined.
